GAME PREVIEW

September 12, 2013

The past couple of weeks have been on a slightly odd schedule since the Lumberjacks made the lengthy journey to Fayetteville two Monday's ago and faced off against the Bulldogs of Fayetteville High School. That was followed by over a week long lay-off and what we have arrived at today, a Thursday night matchup with the Pulaski Academy Bruins.

The Lumberjacks come into tonight's game with a few injuries to get past, but Coach Bo Hembree is expecting to have the personnel available to step up and fill those needed slots.


Who will lead Warren at quarterback is still yet to be determined as senior Drake Jones is still listed as day to day. Junior Justin Gorman is more than capable of taking the reigns against the Bruins if he is needed.

The Lumberjacks still look to have a very strong running game even in the absence of junior power rusher Kilay Cox, as senior Chris Oliver is

Junior wide receiver Darveon Brown is coming off of a top class performance last week at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium after making several big time receptions in the ball game. He could be a go-to weapon for either Warren quarterback as well as senior receiver Von Eric Gonder, who will need his third down sure hands in what promises to be a back and forth game.



Pulaski Academy is coming off of another conference title season last year. They are lead by the elusive sophomore QB Trey Bruce. The Lumberjacks will need to be physical on the defensive front and prepared to keep consistent containment each and every down.

Warren's offense will be lining up against one of the best, if not the best box defenders in Bruins history. Tyler Colquitt is 6'0" and weighs in at 240 lbs. He finished last season with 104 tackles and All-State honors to go alongside. He's a player that an already injury ridden Lumberjack offensive line will have to pay special attention.

The Jacks are hoping to bounce back after a tough week one defeat to Fayetteville that ended 35-21 in favor of the Bulldogs. It was a very close game in most respects and Coach Hembree believes his team was always in a position to win.

The overall goal tonight is of course to get a win, but as always with these early non-conference games another top priority is staying healthy.

A number of fans have already signed on to ride a chartered bus to Little Rock on Thursday evening to cheer on the Jacks and many others are sure to make the trip. We urge all you Lumberjack fans to come support this group of talented young men in their week two quest in Central Arkansas.







RICH IN LUMBERJACK HISTORY AND TALENT.




As the senior Lumberjacks get set for another power packed episode against Pulaski Academy on Thursday night, we will take a few moments this week to step inside the Lumberjack farm system and grab our first look at one of the Jr. Jacks "In the Mill."

Dennis Daniels is a name all Warren fans should become familiar with very soon. young running back is around 5'10" tall and can cut on a dime. Last week during the Jr. Jacks' season opener against Drew Central the talented youngster put on a magnificent display finding the end-zone with a natural prowess. He's a strong runner and one that is tough to bring down. Equipped with terrific vision, Daniels is a true threat beyond the tackles, a trait which could see him line up even in a slot position in

Coach Bo Hembree's offense in the coming years. Daniels will most likely gather the majority of his playing times at tail back however, which is his natural position. Safe with the football, he could be one of the more elusive running backs to come through Warren High School in several years.

For those of you that haven't heard of Dennis Daniels, you might be interested to know that his talents come very naturally. Perhaps it was simply a given that this Jr. Jack would have a knack for gutting defensive fronts. His DNA alone carries enough




evidence of that ability. Daniels is true а Lumberjack by birth. He has a few brothers you could have possibly heard of in the past including Lumberjack great Ricardo Kemp. Kemp was a slot receiver and defender from the 2001, 2002, 2003, and 2004 football seasons. He also is the all time record holder for stolen bases among the illustrious history

of the Warren Lumberjack Baseball Club. During his amazing baseball career, Kemp


stole 71 bases, 36 of which he took during his senior year alone during the Spring of 2005. He has two State Championship Football Rings in his possession from 2001 and 2002, as well as one State Championship Baseball Ring from his 2005 senior vear. Kemp went on to play at Tennessee and later Arkansas Tech. He was recently named the MVP of the CIFL Championship game as a member of the Erie Explosion(an arena football team based out of Erie, Pennsylvania).

Another brother of Dennis Daniels is Chris Alford, a



member of the 2004, 2005, and 2006 Warren Lumberjacks and one of the genuinely nicest people you could ever meet. Alford was a big time running back that could cut up field and leave linebackers jelly legged better than almost any back in Warren's History. He was unfortunately plagued with knee injuries that later hampered his collegiate career, but still nonetheless was a running back with tremendous ability. When healthy, Chris Alford could run with the best of the best.

The most recent brother of Dennis Daniels to have put on the Orange and Black was Raheim Alford, wide receiver for Warren in 2007, 2008, 2009, and 2010. Raheim was a four-year letterman at Warren and was named to the All-Conference team twice in his time with the Jacks. During his senior season at Warren he racked up 1,005



total yards on 68 receptions and scored 14 touchdowns. Raheim Alford went on to attend Henderson State University were he played football for the Reddies.

So it's safe to say Dennis Daniels has the Lumberjacks in his heart. He couldn't really help it after all. Jr. High Football Coach Don Whittemore picked Daniels's talent out almost immediately. His running style is extremely reminiscent of his older brother Chris Alford's, although with what looks to be a bit more power oriented type of play. Daniels still has that unique ability that all of his brothers had to make defenders miss. In open space he can be a real handful for any linebacker, safety, or corner. He is a fairly tall back to still be in Jr. High, a sign that he could perhaps be an even stronger runner at the High School level. His size coupled with his open space agility and speed make Dennis Daniels an excited running back to watch while "In the Mill."

THE MAN BEHIND WARREN FOOTBALL'S MOST SUCCESSFUL YEARS

James Paul Hembree, better known as "Bo", came to Warren in 1998 as a wide receiver and defensive end coach under head coach Tommy Arnold. The following year, Coach

Bo became the offensive coordinator and was later named Lumberjack head football coach and athletic director for Warren.

Some say that athletically, Bo put Warren on the map with two state championships, 2001 and 2002. However, it should be noted that what Bo really did since coming to Warren, is to help more than 37 young men earn



scholarships for chances at higher education. Looking back to the 2000 football season, Michael Alexander was the first Lumberjack under Bo's coaching who was awarded a football scholarship. (UCA) The following year Reid McKinney was awarded a scholarship to Arkansas State along with Paul Harrison to UAM. 2002 was a banner year for scholarships to Warren Lumberjacks: Brett Smith and Roshaun Fellows (Tennessee), Terrance (T-Rod) Hampton ((U of A), Caleb Bateman (UCA), Kendra Rochell (UAM), and Terrence Ingram (Henderson State). 2004 was another good year for Lumberjack scholarships. John William Durman, Aaron Rowell, and Darryl Adams all earned scholarships to Arkansas Tech. Durmon changed schools, walked on at the University of Arkansas and earned a scholarship with the Razorbacks. Ricardo Kemp signed with the University of Tennessee. In 2005, Deante Jackson received a scholarship to Idaho, while Michael Green obtained one to Arkansas Tech and later played for UAM. A.J. Avery earned a scholarship to SAU and later played for Arkansas Baptist. In 2006, Bryan Church was awarded a scholarship to Ouachita Baptist, while Chris Alford earned one to Copiah Lincoln in Mississippi, and Moorehead Jordan, III



was awarded one to Arkansas Baptist. Jarius Wright, Greg Childs, and Chris Gragg all received scholarships to play for the Arkansas Razorbacks from the 2007 Lumberjacks. Basmine Jones signed with the U of A and later played for Arkansas State. Cody Lambert was awarded a scholarship to Tulsa. Anthony Davis was another one who earned a scholarship. Dedrick Hampton in 2008 earned a scholarship to SAU. In 2009, Antonio Harding was awarded a scholarship to UAPB. In 2010, Allen Tatum earned a scholarship to University of Louisiana, Monroe. From the 2010 Jacks, Hayden Smith and Chase Ashcraft were granted scholarships to Henderson State. Eldon Thompson landed a scholarship to Tulsa, while Raheim Alford earned one at Arkansas State and later transferred to Henderson. From the 2012 Jacks, Curtis Martin (Arkansas Baptist) and Jalen Cobb (Coffeeville) both were awarded scholarships. (If we left anyone out, we apologize and will use the excuse that there were so many!)

Three of the former Lumberjacks under Coach Hembree have been drafted by NFL teams: Jarius Wright and Greg Childs (Minnesota Vikings) and Chris Gragg (Buffalo Bills).

Coach Hembree played high school ball for the Osceola Seminoles under the coaching of his father, Jim Hembree. As quarterback for the Seminoles, he earned a scholarship to the University of Central Arkansas to play for the Bears where he also was quarterback. After graduation, he became a graduate assistant at UCA from 1995 to 1996. In 1998, he accepted a job at Warren. where he not only coached football but taught 7th grade social studies.



Bo credits several people as great influences in his "athletic" life. He says. "Number one is my dad." Jim Hembree coached all of Bo's He was a coach at Forrest City, Parkin, Marianna, and Osceola. Bo also lists among the list of influential people in his career Coach Mike Isom at UCA, Bill Keopple who is now at SAU, and former Warren Superintendent Andrew Tolbert.

While the town has received much from the athletic mind and work ethic of Bo Hembree, he has obtained some noteworthy things from Warren. First, it was in Warren that he met and later married his wife, Jaye West Hembree. The Hembrees have three sons: Weston, Braxton, and Tv.

We asked him where the nickname Bo came from, and he told us they just started calling him that as a kid.

In addition to football, Bo has another sporting passion. He is an avid golfer.

When asked what he enjoys most about coaching, Coach Hembree said, "I enjoy seeing kids succeed." On the flip side of that question, he said the most difficult part of coaching is seeing kids fail."

Coach Hembree understands that some have natural talent and ability. But when asked which is the most important, talent or work ethic, he never hesitated with his answer, "Work ethic," and then he credited the kids, "Our kids work so hard."

So, on Friday nights when the ball field lights beam across the field and you see that coach pacing up and down the sideline of the Lumberjacks, tugging on his ears, you aren't just looking at a guy who is the mastermind behind the plays, you are looking at a mentor who has helped bring a great opportunity for a brighter future to so many.
