

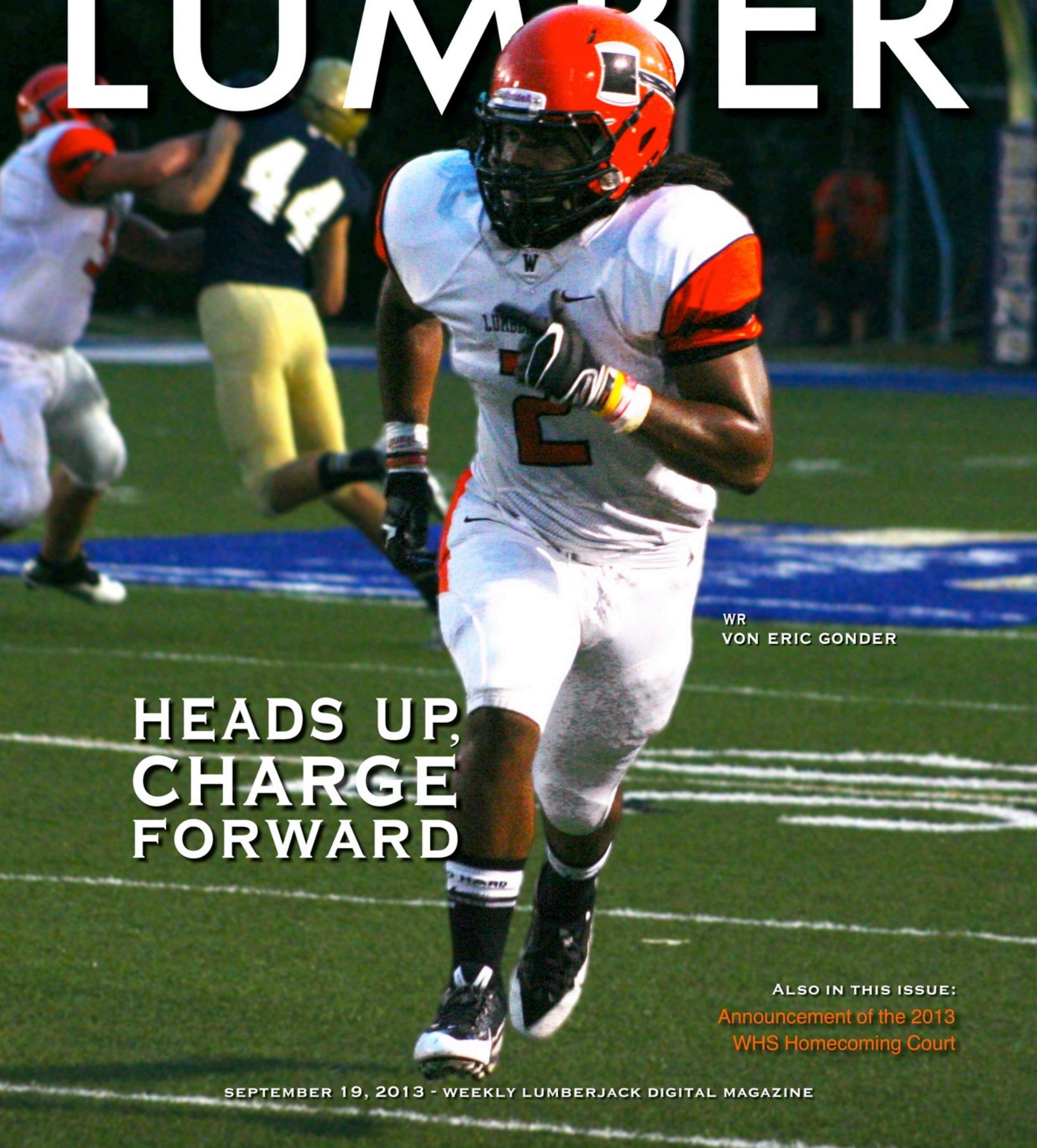

Warren Lumberjacks vs. Camden Fairview Cardinals

GAME PREVIEW

September 20, 2013

Finally! Friday night football is here! After a tough on the road opening two weeks the Lumberjacks return to the Castle of Jim Hurley, Jr. Stadium to take on the Camden Fairview Cardinals in what promises to be a football game displaying some really good talent on both sides.

The Lumberjacks come into the ball game 0-2 after a difficult but close week one loss to Fayetteville High and a week two loss to Pulaski Academy. The Cardinals of Camden Fairview are on the opposite spectrum from the Jacks after starting 2-0. Camden defeated El Dorado 37-42 week one and beat Hamburg 58-21 in week two.

The Cardinals are the defending 5A State Champions and are lead by quarterback Matt Ollison who won the job late last season.



He was the MVP of last years 5A State Title game.

Camden will carry a strong rushing attack on the back of a solid offensive line and a tough running back core. Senior running back and wide out Deion Holliman is 5'9" 180 lbs. and averaged 11.7 yards per carry last season.

The Lumberjacks meanwhile will be battling a mental game. They are coming off of two difficult losses and some high profile injuries, but Head Coach Bo Hembree is rightfully optimistic about is team's chances. The Jacks will get back junior running back Trent Broughton who immediately adds another dimension to the Warren attack.

According to Coach Hembree, senior quarterback Drake

Jones will be sitting this ball game out. The senior was injured in the week one game against Fayetteville, but was able to tough out a long game in week to at Pulaski Academy. The goal is to have him rested for conference play starting next week.

Junior quarterback Justin Gorman is going to be taking the majority of the snaps. He played several series last week and look sharp.

The Lumberjack defensive line is looking to bounce back after a difficult week last Thursday night against that extremely solid P.A. Bruin's offensive line. The Jacks will need to find a bit more of a pass rush to complete the job this week against Camden Fairview.

Limiting and eradicating turnovers has been a topic talked about in the Lumberjack Field House all week. The Jacks are hoping to get rid of the fumbles and be tactically clinical on special teams.

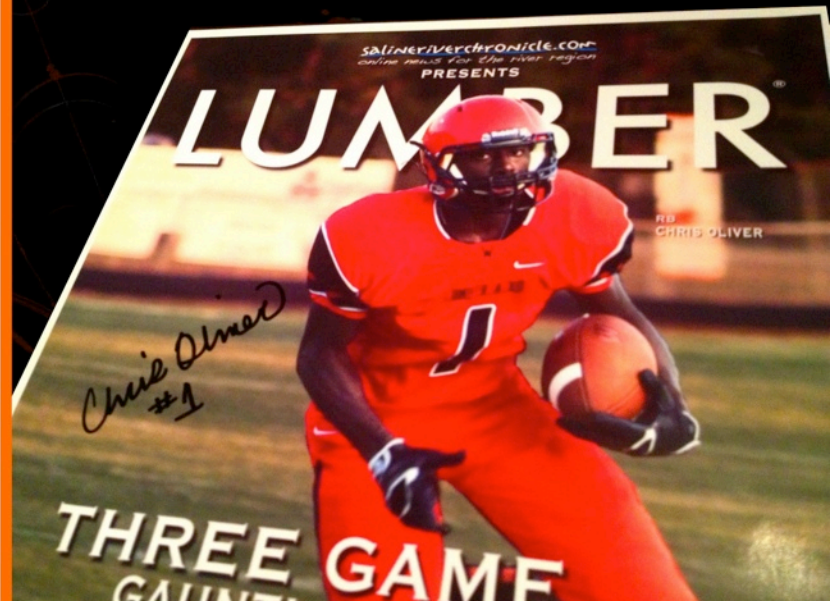

HEADS UP, CHARGE FORWARD

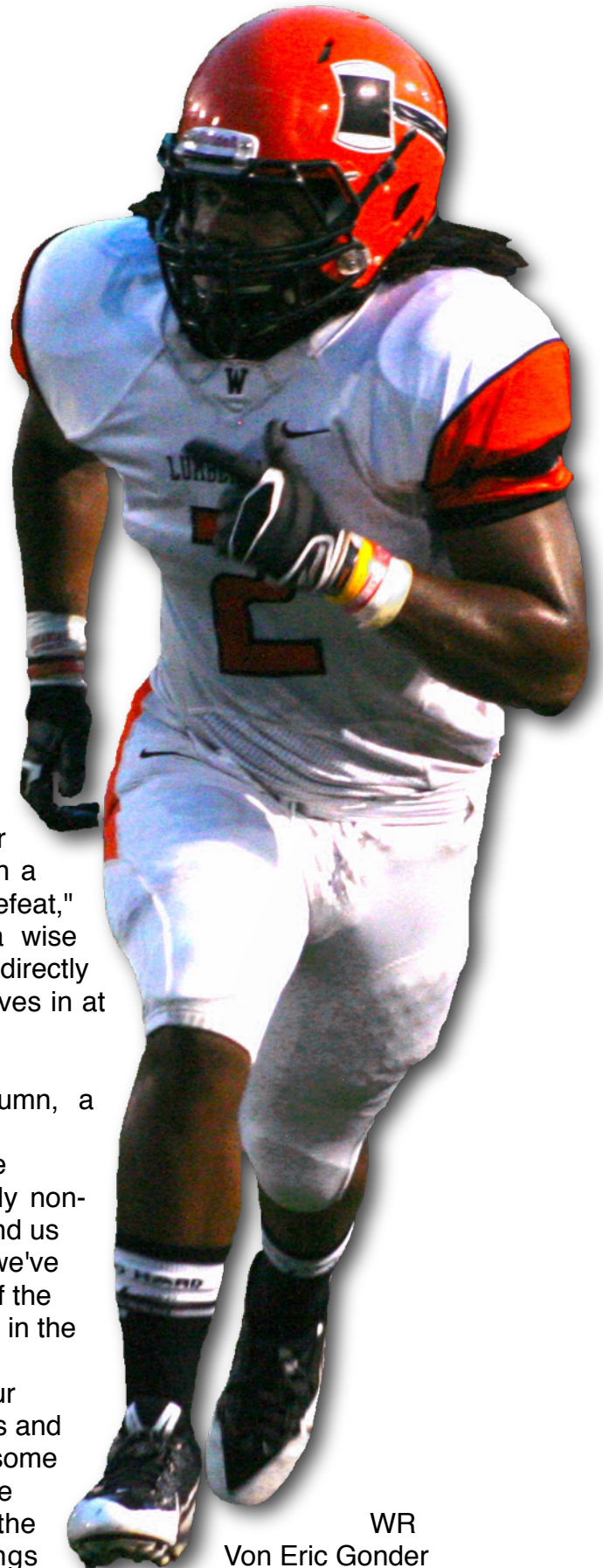

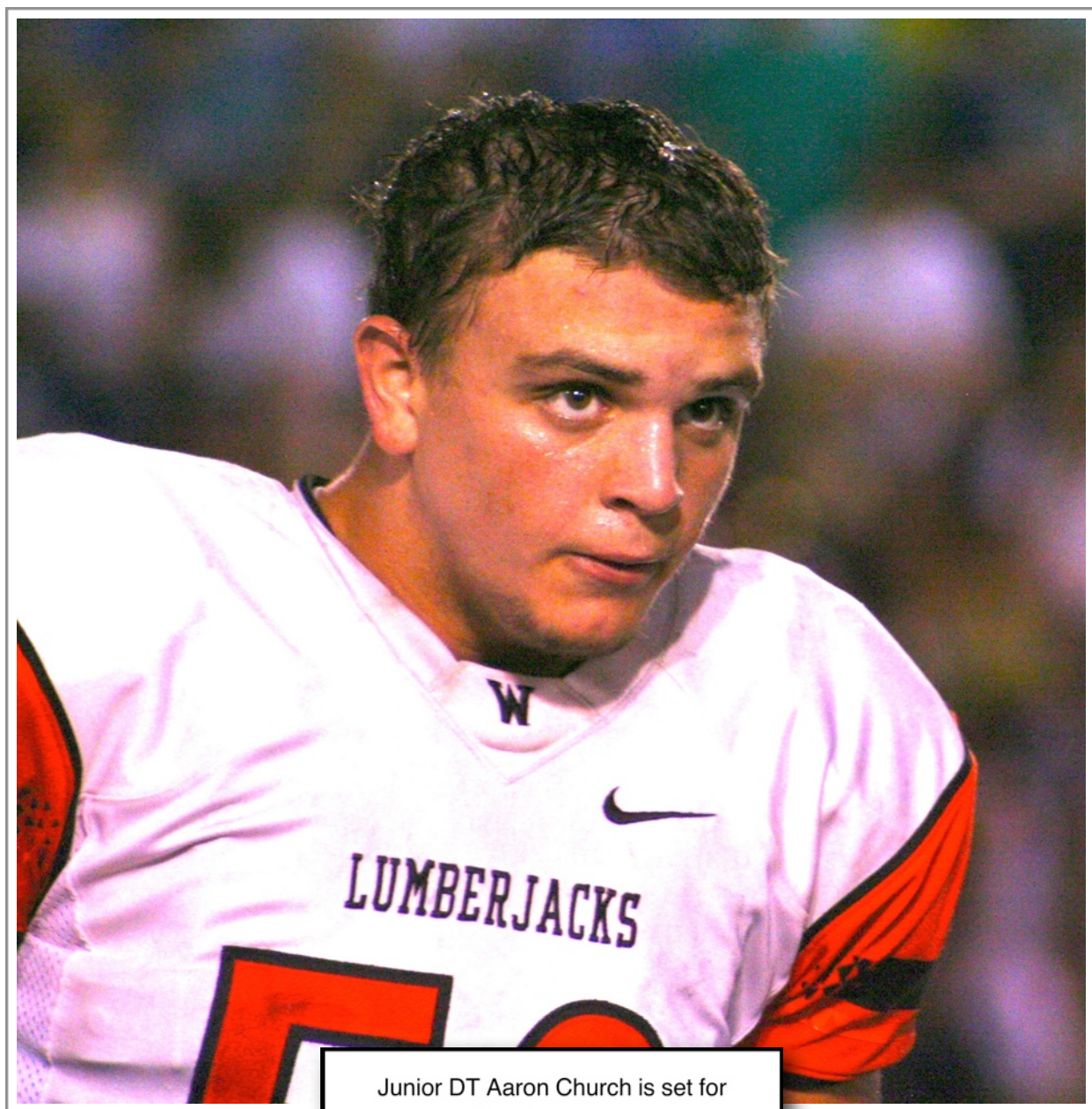

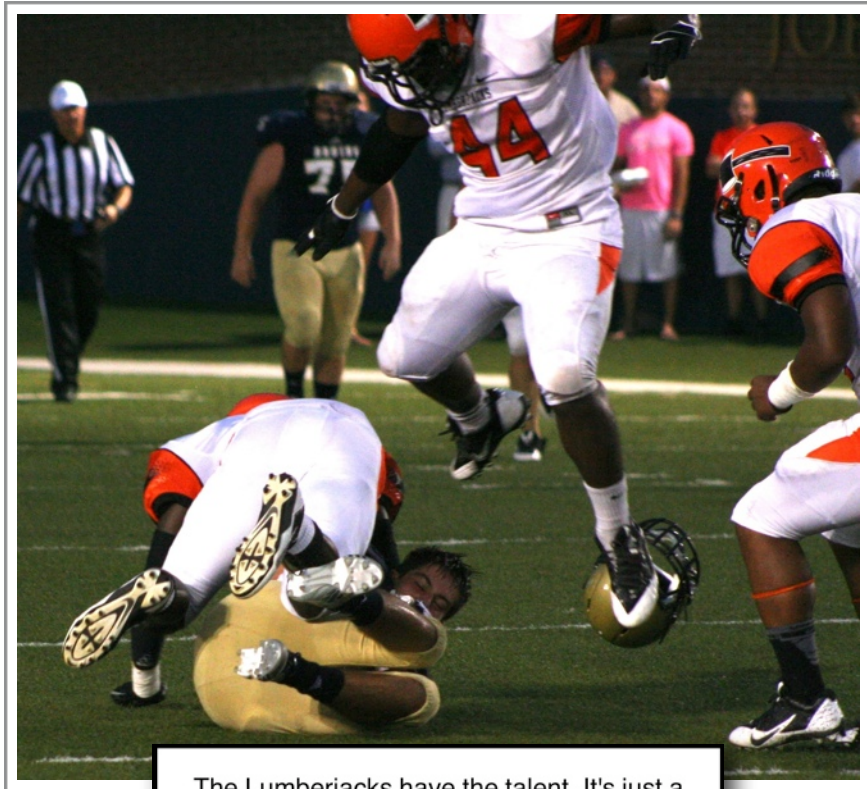
I still remember firing a ball into foul territory down the third base line while trying to pick a runner off at third at Glen Rose in 2005 with the ball game tied. My wild throw allowed the winning run to score. There isn't a much lonelier feeling. Trust me.

The year before in 2004 we lost in the semi-finals of the State Playoffs by the gut wrenching score of 2-1. During our playoff run in 2005 we were absolutely drummed in the Regional Tournament finals 25-4 by Ashdown. It doesn't get much worse on a baseball field. Our hearts were down after that ball game, but we pretty quickly realized what I hope this Lumberjack football team will realize. Tomorrow is another day. Just a few days later we stormed Baum Stadium in Fayetteville and lifted the AAA State Championship trophy, having mercy ruled every team in the State tournament except for one. It was one of the most dominating series of games I have ever been a part of. We were undoubtable the best baseball team in Arkansas class AAA. Suddenly standing together in elation of a State Championship ring destined for our fingers, that 25-4 loss seemed so long ago.

This Lumberjack football team should be proud. They've held their own with giants. I'm sure it's been an emotional nightmare to start 0-2 for these kids. For us Lumberjacks a loss is a loss, no matter how big the opponent may be. Frankly, that's not a bad thing. We expect excellence from ourselves. We have confidence that we are capable of playing with anyone. I like that. I think that alone is something we can hang our hats on.

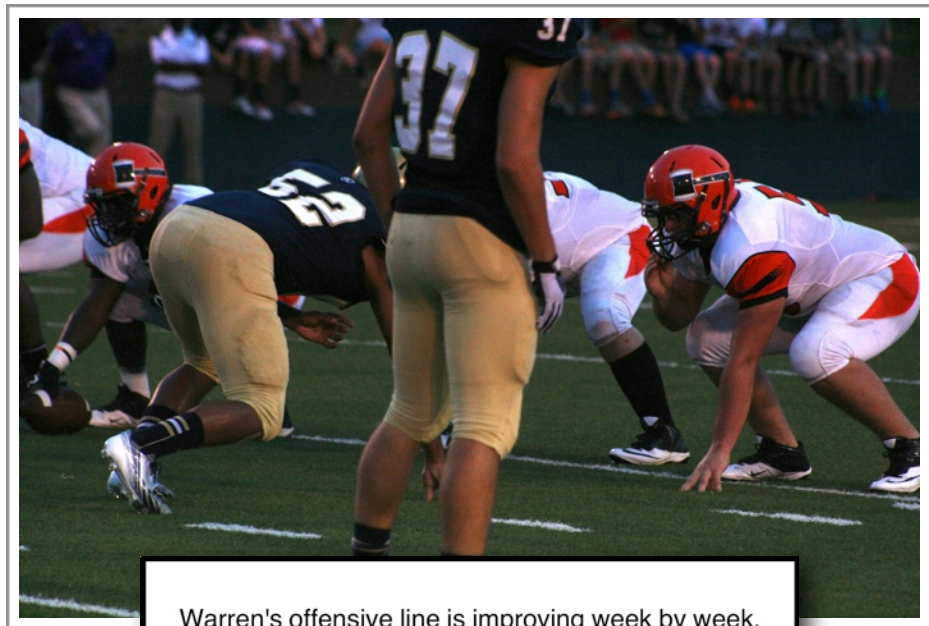


The Lumberjacks have the talent. It's just a matter of putting it all together.

I was probably most impressed with Drake Jones. This young man has some heart. He may get to rest this next week, but we can look forward to his certain return. The gritty toughness that he showed was astounding. He even played both ways several times throughout the night against P. A. I've never been a big fan of quarterbacks who put their own safety above the success of a crucial play. I know some would disagree with me on that point, but it's football after all. It's a contact sport and a sturdy determined attitude is sometimes required. Jones was real leader on the field. He ran with strength and resiliency and acted like a commander must. I've been proud of Drake. Our secondary was superb most of the night I thought. Their pass coverage was like white on rice for a majority of the ball game. The few blown pass plays I saw unfortunately had more to do with a lack of pressure on Pulaski Academy's quarterback.

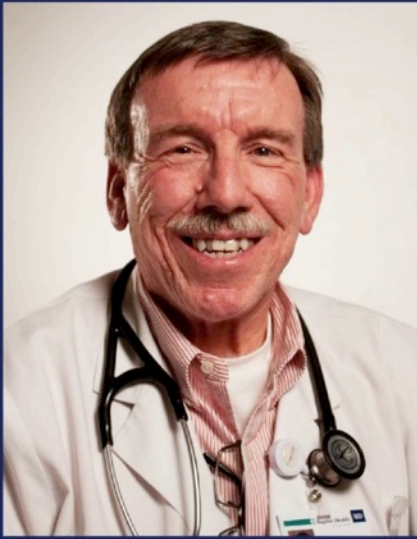
