



### BUCKLING UP

with a storm brewing, the orange & black will batten down the hatches

We Lumberjack supporters and athletes alike have been through a tumultuous week. It's been amazing in some respects, considering that had just a couple of plays gone our way Monday evening against Fayetteville, perhaps we could have actually knocked off the two-time defending 7A State Champions in their own home city. Unfortunately that didn't happen. Those plays didn't fall our way. We even a few times early in Monday's ball game, tripped over our own feet and handed Fayetteville 14 quick first quarter points. From there, we hung on, and I thought fought with a great It wasn't a roaring spirit. comeback, but we certainly made life difficult for the Bulldogs. the end it was a 35-21 loss. prediction, which I never tell our viewers on Lumberjack LIVE, was what I would say "pretty close to

that." However, a loss it was and a tough one to take surprisingly.

As we made the terribly long drive to Fayetteville Monday, I already in my mind was in reality expecting 41 players against over 140 for Fayetteville just didn't



give off the vibe of a possible win, but after the game I felt downright sad about the loss. I wasn't disappointed in our guys. I truthfully felt like overall we played pretty well. Stats showed that we had more yards than the Bulldogs. There is always room to improve of course, but let's face facts. We just stood up to a team that carried a depth chart we will only ever dream of in terms of pure numbers and bodies,



and we actually had our chances to get the W.

It was remarkable. At times and in certain areas of the field it was plain to see we were outmatched, but overall we were in my opinion every bit as talented as Fayetteville when it came to our first 11 on their first 11. I give a lot of credit to our group of young men. They battled through some tough earlier goings and made a game of it. Again



however, it was a loss. We are 0-1, which was honestly to be expected. Guess what? That 0-1 doesn't mean anything whatsoever when it comes to playoff contention and seeding. We are fine in that respect. Things matter for real starting week four. Until then I just want to work to improve and stay healthy.

On the healthy note, we have hit a few snags, but Warren will have to overcome. The big fear in these opening three weeks has always been injuries. Playing teams like Fayetteville, Pulaski Academy, and Camden Fairview is a daunting task. We simply don't want to find ourselves in a position of having to rely on limited depth.

In the past few years we've been somewhat lucky. For the most part injuries have eluded us, and us them, but Monday was a

different ball game. Perhaps it was an omen that big grey clouds hovered over Jim Hurley Jr. Stadium Monday morning. (STORY CONTINUES AFTER NEXT AD)





Unbeknownced to us fans, storm clouds were rolling into Donald W. Reynold's Razorback Stadium as we took the field Monday evening. It wasn't the kind that brought rain. Rather, it was the kind that brought those reviled and feared injuries.

The first injury literally made my heart spike about a thousand percent as I watched from inside the press box. Our reliable, powerful, and confident running back Kilay Cox was dragged down by his face mask in the first half along Warren's sideline. Almost immediately you could see the pain in Cox's reaction to the tackle. He rolled over and reached for his left ankle. When on the sideline after the play was over, Cox sat on the bench with a look that I myself have had many times before throughout my years of breaking bones playing baseball. It was a look of let down. Players like Cox just want to be in the action.



That injury was followed up in the second half with one of Warren's go to wide receivers Jaylon Marshall taking an awkward tumble.

Moments later another wide receiver Terrez Hampton went down and didn't get up. Hampton caught a pass and was pulled down in a difficult looking contortion.



Throughout the entire game, Warren never looked out of contention. Our offense moved the ball with relative consistency, lead by quarterback Drake Jones. Senior running back Chris Oliver and junior Trent Broughton both stepped up and played marvelously. Wideout Darveon Brown made several outstanding catches which helped Warren to find themselves twice inside the twenty yard line with a chance to tie the Defensively. game. junior LaFoy Smith became the attack man of the night. He was a balancing force against a strong front five of Fayetteville.

We have a lot to be

proud of as a community of Jacks. Our team played with fervor.

Even though it went down as a loss(35-21), the bigger concern as we drove home from the Ozarks was of course the injuries.


Today, we still aren't sure about the exact extent of the injuries. While rumors have been swirling around social media, no official injury report has been given by the Lumberjack staff. We hope to learn more information during The Bo Show next week when we sit down with Coach Hembree.

The Lumberjacks now face, just as they did before this week, two more Goliaths. Of the two non-conference games we still have to go, Pulaski Academy may be the best candidate for a win. A slightly smaller opponent in depth, the Bruins still won't be a cupcake, but certainly Warren has plenty enough talent to go into Little Rock next Thursday expecting to compete for the win. Of course week three brings the Camden Fairview Cardinals. This is a team with rocket speed at the skilled positions and a taste for glory having just come off of a State Championship season in 2012.

In other words the Lumberjacks have some work to do, but it can be done and they are not afraid of work. The question is how do we if necessary adapt to the winds that have blown ashore in the form of injuries?

For starters we still don't know the official situation of any of these players. It's entirely possible you could see some of them back for Pulaski Academy or perhaps at least by conference play.

Kilay Cox has been the starter at running back from day one. The junior is explosive with the football and is the type of back that linebackers don't want to meet up with in open space. He likes to take them on. The number two man on the depth chart is senior Chris Oliver. Oliver is 5'7", 165 lbs. of pure speed. He is one of the fastest, if not the fastest guy on the whole squad. He is a real danger to any defense outside of the tackles with a second and third gear that leaves nothing but dust in his path. Junior 5'7"



166 lbs. Trent Broughton is equally effective. He has a good mix of Cox's power and Oliver's speed. The bottom line is that we have solid depth at running back and strong leadership in senior Chris Oliver. These two guys are going to see a lot of playing time this season. They offer a different type of rushing attack and can both find the end-zone.



Wide receiver Jaylon Marshall's injury looked to me to be the least severe. Again, I'm not educated on the specifics of any of these injuries, but we again have solid depth at this position. taking into account Terrez Hampton's later injury, and Marshall's, Warren can fill these gaps with talent if need Sophomore receiver Franklin Gilmore is 5'7" 153 lbs. While his stature may yet n o t astronomical, he really impressed me in the scrimmage against Stuttgart. Equipped with a good set of hands and an instinct to find the open gaps in coverage, look for Gilmore to see more of the field in the next couple of weeks.

Senior quarterback Drake Jones has over


the Spring and Summer taken a strong position as a leader of this team and everyone seems to play better when he's at the helm. I don't see Drake being out for an extremely long period of time if at all, but the good news is that backup quarterback and senior Justin Gorman has plenty of starter's experience, getting the post five times last season. He's got a solid arm and usually makes pretty descent decisions in the pocket. He's not necessarily the running threat that Drake is, but he is an aptly able offensive

commander. I would put my full faith in Gorman to go out and get us a win every time he takes the field. He will not have any trouble filling that role if the need arrises.

The Lumberjacks still have guys to step up and perform in big ways, even if we are without a couple of guys for a week or two. I think senior linebacker Kendrick Newton is set for a massive season alongside D'Angelo McCoy, Daquan Daniels, Odis Miller, Caylx Harris, and Aaron Church. Offensively Darveon Brown will be an essential piece of the puzzle for Coach Hembree's team. He hauled in a spectacular grab on Monday night that was reminiscent of Bret Smith. Von Eric Gonder is as I've said before our 3rd down salvation, and offensive linemen such as 6'2" 260 lbs. Wesley Cornish will anchor the men of the axe along the trenches.

We could very well once again see ourselves start 0-3, although I'm thinking we will find a victory against Pulaski Academy and start 1-2, but we will weather the storm.

I remember assistant Coach Robert Laster telling us Lumberjacks during our 2005 State Baseball Championship run that each night someone different would have to be the hero. He was right. Each night a new face rose to the top and came up with that one crucial play that sealed the deal. We went on to win the State Championship that year. This team will weather this storm and every night someone different will step up and contribute in a big way. So let's get behind this team Warren. Go Jacks!!!


