

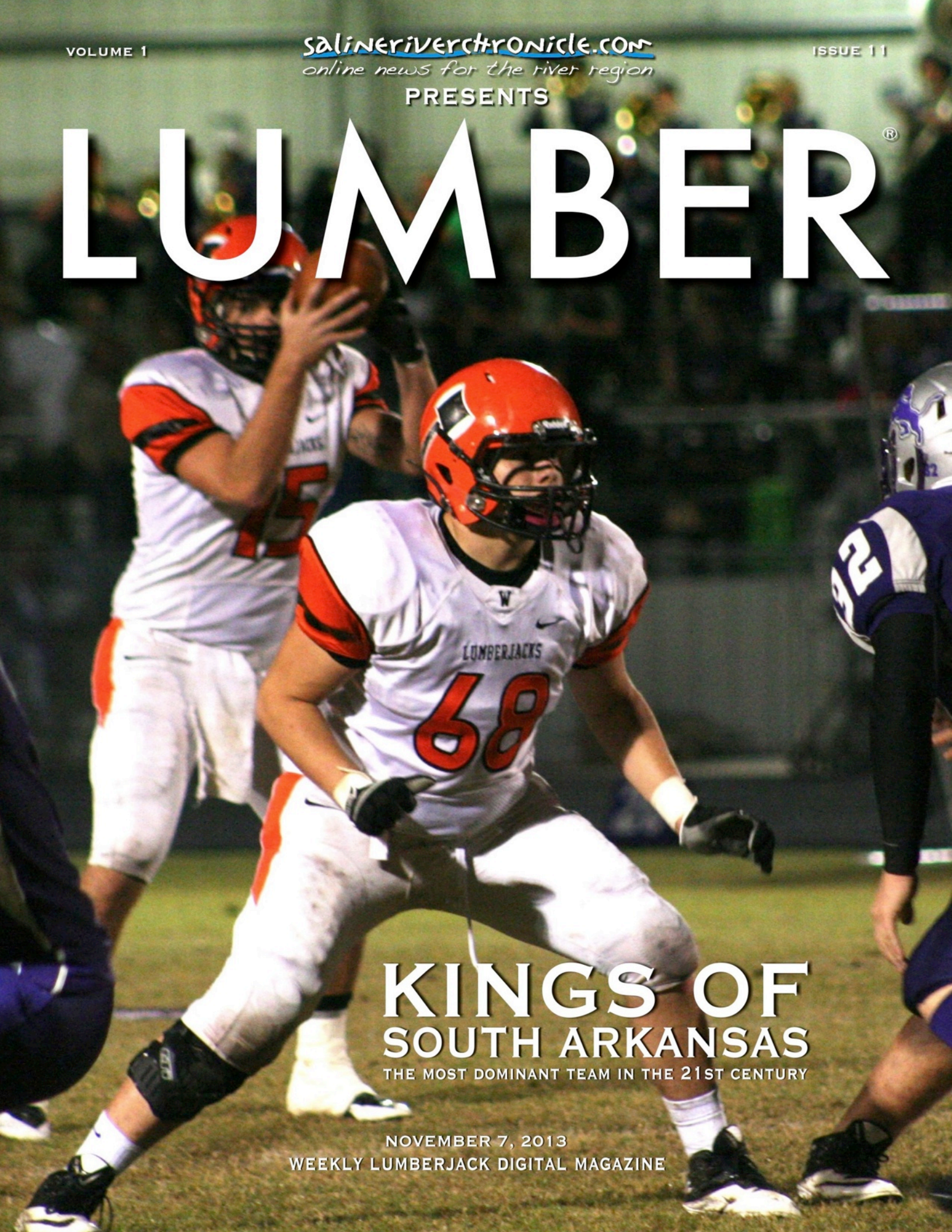

Warren Lumberjacks vs. Lake Village Beavers

GAME PREVIEW

November 7, 2013

Game day has arrived! Tonight is the final regular season game of the 2013 Lumberjack Football schedule. The Lumberjacks secured the first seed from the 8-4A after defeating Hamburg last week by the score of 32-13, capturing the 8-4A Conference Championship for the 10th time in 14 years. Lake Village is on the opposite side of the spectrum at 1-8 overall. The Beavers only win came against Drew Central in the non-conference week three. Since that time Lake Village has struggled mightily, having dropped six games in a row and given up a total of 285 points in those same six games.

The Lumberjacks are likely to try to put this game away very early on, so starters and those who have been nursing injuries this season can get some much needed rest. The Jacks will still be focusing in on this ball game, as at times in the past Lake Village has given the Orange and Black a headache, but Warren feels confident that they will be able to work some guys in this week that are young and have a big future. You will



likely see Trent Broughton running the football a good

bit of the night, and there is even the possibility of freshman Dennis Daniels picking up some carries.

Back up QB Justing Gorman is hoping to get significant playing time, as are a number of other athletes who currently sit second on the depth chart.

Defensively, the Jacks just want to stay healthy this week and perhaps get some rest. This defense faced one of it's toughest offenses last week and passed with flying colors, but reports are that a knock or two was picked up.

Lake Village comes into this game a bit scattered. They are playing under new head coach Tarek Anderson who took the reigns just this past season. They are a team which has a few athletes and could put things together in the next two or three years to try to compete for a playoff spot.

Lumberjack LIVE Will Not Provide Streamcasts of Playoff Games, But Will Have LIVE Text Updates

Rob Reep, owner of salineriverchronicle.com, formally announced last night that no playoffs games would be covered LIVE this season, but that viewers can keep up with the games LIVE through a LIVE Game Blog on the sports page each game night.

For those of you who have watched Lumberjack LIVE who live a great distance away and simply can't make it to the ball games, our Lumberjack LIVE crew has come up with an innovative solution that will allow you to keep up with what's going on during the game LIVE. We are calling it "Lumberjack LIVE Game Blog."

The way it works is super simple! All you will have to do to follow the game LIVE is visit our sports page during the game. There you will find a post that has a twitter feed embedded within the article. Just sit back and watch the live text updates roll in. Depending on your computer's browser, you will not have to refresh the page for it to update! Some users may be required to simply refresh the page from time to time, but the updates will be there. Our crew will be bringing you updates on every touchdown, big play, and more the entire night. These updates will come in every minute to three minutes.

KINGS OF SOUTH ARKANSAS

The Most Dominant Team in the 21st Century

Ten conference championships in fourteen years. Just try and wrap your head around that for a moment. That's what the Warren Lumberjacks solidified last Friday night as they dismantled the last possible contender for the 8-4A Title race.

It's a tradition that goes back 107 years ago, when Warren High School fielded it's first football team that was nicknamed the Lumberjacks. Not only outstanding world class athletes have been produced, but great teams and great programs. Warren's men's basketball team won what I believe to be the first ever State Championship for any of the schools programs during the early 1900's. Warren's football team produced some of the best talent from South Arkansas during the 50's, 60's, and 70's. Athletes such as Tommy Lawrence, Jerry Watts, and of course the multi generational Cuthbertson brothers, Jimmy, John, and Robert, all gained Statewide recognition for the talent. Many modern Warren athletes know and



follow avidly Lumberjacks such as Jarius Wright, Greg Childs, and Chris Gragg, all of whom are currently in the NFL. Most of them probably don't remember or even know the name Johnny Cole, a Lumberjack football player who went on to play for the Baltimore Colts, now the Indianapolis Colts. Tommy Lawrence, a Warren standout, would also go on to play professionally. The Lady Jack track and field program was a dominant force throughout the State during the 80's and 90's. Yolanda Washington was



a leading athlete on several of those track and field teams during the 1980's. Other women also made names for themselves as Lumberjack athletes. Brandy Brown stands as perhaps the greatest tennis player in Warren's history and was one of the absolute best in the State of Arkansas. Warren has had an alustrious history of great baseball talent with one State Championship under the programs belt in 2005 and players such as Josh McClain, Matt Pace, Kyle Wagnon, and Ricardo Kemp all dawning the Orange and Black since the 1980's. Many other names exist from many sports over multiple generations. Robert Denton, Jim Mullins, William Powell, Robert Dew, Drew Tool, Carrol "Booger" Brown, Alonzo Hampton, Shirley Childs, Paul Harrison, and many more have represented the school admirably on the field and in the classroom. The list could literally go on and on.

Coach Bo Hembree will certainly be among the list of future inductees to the Lumberjack Hall of Fame. His

tenure at the helm of Warren's football program has been accompanied by ten conference championships in just fourteen years. He has presided over what has to be undoubtably the "golden age" of Warren football. Two State Championships have been won in three State Title appearances. The 2001 team was arguably the best of them all. Led by quarterback Reid McKinney, the 2001 Lumberjacks were a scoring machine. Unmatched at the skill positions, there was a fire among that team that just never went out. They will forever go down as the first to bring a Football State Championship home to Warren. Names such as Bret Smith, Terrance Hampton, Roshaun Fellows, and Caleb Bateman were all well known by most little boys who dreamed of one day playing for Warren. Heroes they became in that magical season. The 2002 team carried on that same task as though it was a given. Many of the same names returned from the



year prior, alongside a few new names like Ricardo Kemp. While State Championships have eluded the Jacks since 2002, conference titles have been of plenty. In 2003 the Jacks picked up another conference championship. In 2005 and 2006 the same outcome, and so on and so forth.

Friday night's big win against Hamburg was not just a ticket to a bye in the first round of the playoffs. Yes, that was important and the team's focus will be on making yet another run at a State Championship. However, don't get complacent to winning conference titles year in an year out. They are very special and something not to be taken for granted. I'm sure we will look back one day with fond memories of these days. Somewhere at Eastside Elementary there is a young boy who lives for each Friday night because he gets to go watch Drake "Tonka" Jones fling the ball around the field. Somewhere in that same classroom there is likely a kid who wants to be as fast and as powerful as Kilay Cox, or as hard hitting as Caylx Harris. They are watching and the next generation is finding it's inspiration. Those of us who have been fortunate enough to represent our hometown and school all started out that same way. For me, I went to baseball practice as a youngster influenced by many hours spent watching Trent Scogin behind for plate for the Lumberjacks. I wanted to be that.

The past decade has been a dream for Warren fans. We have witnessed some of the greatest Lumberjack sports moments acted out by some of the greatest Lumberjacks ever. We have been lucky to have seen what we have seen and been able to be a part of such a great and successful family.
